from Acts 2

After Jesus' resurrection, Peter spoke to the people "Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and was put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him.

God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. God has made this Jesus, whom was crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, “Brothers, what shall we do?”

Peter replied, “Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call.”

Acts 5:29-31

After this, Peter and the other Apostles were told by the religious leaders of the day not to tell the people about Jesus’ resurrection from the grave.

Peter and the other apostles replied: “We must obey God rather than human beings! The God of our ancestors raised Jesus from the dead—whom was killed by hanging on a cross. God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might bring all to repentance and forgive their sins.”

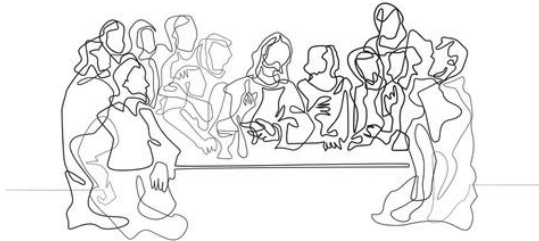

Lord's Supper

Taking the Lord's Supper

Scripture Reading 1 Corinthians 11:23–25:

“For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, ‘This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.’

*(we take the bread together in remembrance of the sacrifice
Jesus made for us-take, eat)*

In the same way also He took the cup, after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.’”

*(we drink the cup together in remembrance of the sacrifice
Jesus made for us-take, drink)*

Our gracious God, You are holy. Thank you for enabling us to respond in faith to Jesus' sacrifice for us. Thank you for your sure promise that You live in our hearts now and that we will share eternal life with You. We give you glory forever!
